CAREFULLY**

FLOWER SHOW RULES

1. All exhibits must be grown or made by the exhibitor, with the exception of classes in the Floral Arts Section. The exhibitor may acquire flowers for this Section.
2. Every exhibit must bear a number, which will be issued at the show venue on the afternoon or evening prior to the Show, or on the morning of the Show (see back cover). **Exhibits must be in position by 9.30 am on the day of the Show.** Exhibitors will be responsible for placing exhibits and checking that they are correct.
3. It is hoped that exhibitors will allow their exhibits to be sold for the benefit of Show Funds. Please indicate your wishes on the entry form or otherwise advise the Secretary
4. The Committee will take ordinary care of all exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
5. **The decision of the Judges will be final.**
6. In the event of a points draw the trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of 'First' places.
7. **ALL CUPS** must be returned to the Secretary by **1st July** each year.
8. All exhibitors must:
either reside within one and a half miles of Lee Memorial Hall, as the crow flies,
or be a member of the Lee Women's Institute wherever they might live,
or be immediate family (including grandchildren) to any of the above,
or be by invitation of the Chairman of the Committee.

SECTION A - FLORAL ART

Class

1. **“Fairy Garden”**; A miniature garden;
not to exceed 15” (381mm) wide. Accessories may be used.
2. **“An English Country Garden”**; An arrangement of flowers;
not to exceed 20” (508mm) wide. Accessories may be used.
3. **“Volcano”**; An arrangement of flowers and foliage;
not to exceed 20” (508mm) wide.
4. **“A Gentleman’s Buttonhole”**; A miniature bouquet of flowers and foliage;
not to exceed 4” (101mm) wide.
5. **“Coronation”**; An arrangement of flowers and foliage;
not to exceed 20” (508mm) wide. Accessories may be used.

SECTION B - DOMESTIC

Use own recipe except for Class 8, which is inside the back cover.

‡ Please indicate the key ingredients for Classes 6, 14 & 15.

Metal lids may be used on jam jars **provided they are new**.

All exhibits to be displayed on the paper plates provided.

Not to exceed 8" by 6" (203 x 153mm)

- 72 A painting or picture of '**Still Life**'
In any medium, e.g. oils, watercolour, pastels etc.

Children's Classes will be judged in two age groups: -

Classes 74-80 - aged 8 years or under

Classes 81-87 - aged 9 to 12 years.

The age of child (but not name) should be shown on the Place Card.

- 74 & 81 Floral Art An arrangement of Flowers in a child's wellington
boot.
- 75 & 82 Domestic Two Gingerbread Men.
- 76 & 83 Domestic A Savoury Twist.
- 77 & 84 Produce A Vegetable Monster.
Any number of vegetables may be used.
- 78 & 85 Produce A Garden on a dinner plate.
- 79 & 86 Handicraft A piece of driftwood art.

RECIPE

Apple and Ginger Cake (Class 8)

Ingredients

9oz (250g)	plain flour
8oz (220g)	soft brown sugar
2 tblsp (36 ml)	treacle
6oz (150g)	butter
2 tsp. (12 ml)	bicarbonate of soda
1 tsp (6 ml)	baking powder
6 fl oz (160 ml)	buttermilk ‡
1 medium	egg, beaten
3 tsp. (20 ml)	ground ginger
2 medium	apples peeled and chopped

‡ To make buttermilk mix together 1 tablespoon of lemon juice and 8 fl oz of milk (225 ml) and leave to stand for 10 minutes

Preheat oven, to 170 °C / 340 °F / Gas Mark 3

Grease and line a 9 inch (23 cm) baking tin

Melt the butter, sugar and treacle, in a saucepan, over a low heat.

Remove from the heat when melted and leave to cool slightly.

Add the buttermilk and egg; stir well and then add the chopped apple.

In a separate bowl mix all the dry ingredients then add the butter mix and combine.

Place in a baking tin and bake for 30-35 minutes.

Allow to cool before cutting and serving.

Any number of entries admitted per person per class.

Exhibits may be staged from
2.00 to 4.00 pm and 6.00 to 7.30 pm on Wednesday
or 8.00 to 9.30 am on the morning of the Show.

**At 9.30 am on the day of the Show the Hall will be cleared of all persons not officially engaged
by the committee.**

Exhibits remaining after 5.00 pm will be deemed for sale
but exhibitors are asked not to remove exhibits until after the presentations.

POINTS

will be awarded as follows:

'First' = 3 points; **'Second'** = 2 points; **'Third'** = 1 point
'Special', (one per Section); = 2 extra points

The winner in each section will be awarded a gift token in addition to the trophy.
Monetary awards will be made for a **'First, Second or Third'**
in Children's Classes only

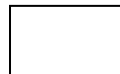
